## OFFERING PATIENTS QUALITY AND SAFE CARE

Imagine your daily work being turned upside down from one day to the next. Longer and longer workdays, weekends on the job, struggling to keep up with new protective measures... It was a brutal year for medical teams. A year marked by tremendous loss, but also filled with small victories.

This is Dr. Chantal Vallée's new reality. She is one of the faces of the struggle to manage the pandemic at Hôpital Charles-Le Moyne, designated an alert 2 level hospital. She was pivotal in transforming the hospital to accommodate COVID-19 patients. Creating dedicated units, reorganizing patient flows, redefining the delivery of care. A vast undertaking in the blink of an eye.

She was a frontline witness to your unwavering support over the last few months. From new high-tech equipment to free access to TVs and lunch for staff members. So many gestures—made possible with your donations—have been a balm on the wounds of our patients and our teams on the ground.

The role of donors like you, in a pandemic of this scale, was vital over the last year. You ensured the delivery of quality, safe, high-tech healthcare. Care that meets the needs of the population of the Montérégie, and beyond. You protected our teams. You brought families together. Simply put—you had a direct impact on the comfort of our patients and our staff.



## BREAKING THE ISOLATION OF FAMILIES


"It all started with a small cough and a slight headache. I didn't want to take any chances—it was time for a COVID test. The whole family tested positive. Then Martin came down with a fever, a serious cough and major fatigue. It was straight to the hospital. The virus moved into his lungs. Diabetes, cholesterol, overweight, sleep apnea. The perfect storm of risk factors. He was transferred to intensive care, and spent four days in a coma.

I was so worried. We were all so worried. But we were three, while Martin was all ALONE with his fear. One day, the girls and I drove to the hospital. We drove around it. We sent him positive vibes from right outside. We talked to him... not in person, but from the car. We hoped that somehow he'd hear us and feel our wave of love.

And I think he did... The next day, we FaceTimed. It was very emotional. A few days later, Super Martin scored a K.O. against the virus. But COVID left its mark: shortness of breath, fatigue... We were scared. He was scared of dying. I was scared of losing him."

The Lepage family's story is a testament to the distress of patients and families separated by the lockdown. By financing the purchase of tablets, you broke the isolation of patients. Thanks to you, their loved ones could be by their bedside. You made a huge difference for entire families who were left helpless in their isolation.





## SUPPORTING THE MENTAL HEALTH OF YOUNG PEOPLE

"I remember getting a call from the principal. I was in a meeting. Things weren't going well with Renaud. I told him I'd talk to my son that evening. He said, 'No, this can't wait.' I left work in a panic. Renaud was in pieces. We'd hit a wall."

Renaud was in Grade 8, and his parents were shocked to learn that their son had to be admitted to the Hospital's child psychiatry day centre. It all started in Grade 7. Panic attacks. Lack of self-confidence. Performance anxiety. Dependent relationships. Dark thoughts. Things were going from bad to worse until the day the school sent them to Emergency.

Renaud admits that if he had not immediately been taken into care for his anxiety, he doesn't know where he'd be today. Possibly on the verge of dropping out. But then: psychological testing, therapy, academic support. Renaud learned how to cope with the challenges of daily life. And his parents, once at a complete loss, learned how to find the right words. It was a very challenging period, but a necessary one. So much so that Normand decided to make a major donation to help other young people like Renaud overcome their difficulties.

Every day, every month, every year that passes and that we don't intervene medically to help a young person in crisis comes at an enormous cost. For the young person in distress. For society. Your support was even more vital this year with the increase in demand for mental health support due to the pandemic. Thanks to you, young people found the tools they needed in time to lead a healthy life and to avoid even more serious problems.
